**REFRESHMENTS – VET ON CALL (THE STABLES) – OUTDOOR ALL WEATHER WARM UP**

**CLASS 1A      CLEAR ROUND – 55cm (NO FILLERS)**

**9am**

Clear round £5 per individual combination.  
Last entry for clear round at 9.45 am.

**CLASS 1      ROUND 1 – 60cm    ROUND 2 – 65cm (NO FILLERS)**

**10am**

This class is aimed at young horses/ novice riders/ inexperienced combinations.  
NO pony/horse may be BS registered. Horse/Pony must not have BS winnings.  
Horse/pony/combination MUST NOT have been placed at Area Level.  
MUST NOT have won a show jumping competition at 80cm or above at the close of entries.

**CLASS 2      ROUND 1 – 70cm    ROUND 2 – 75cm**

Combination MUST NOT have been placed at Area Level at 80cm or above.  
Horse/Pony may be BS registered but MUST NOT have winnings.

**CLASS 3      ROUND 1 – 80cm    ROUND 2 – 85cm**

Open to any combination.  
May be BS registered and have winnings.

Each class will be open to Teams of 3 or 4 members from the same Riding Club/Pony Club/ Organisation or just friends. The best three scores will count. All teams will be judged together. Should a team be eliminated in Round 1, the complete team, at the judge's discretion, may be allowed to jump in Round 2.

An Individual Competition will be incorporated into the Team competition. The results will be based on the Round 2 timings.

Rosettes – to the first 6 teams and to the individual first 6 placings. Sashes to the winning team.

Entry fees £30 team of 4, £25 team of 3. **Cheques payable to Brent Knoll Riding Club**

BKRC reserve the right to limit entries and close entries early if class is full.

### **TIMES**

Times will be on BKRC and Stretcholt EC website by the evening of Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> Oct. Times are a guide only. Teams will jump in the order stated on the entry form. Please be prompt/early.

### **RULES**

- Entries will be limited in each class.
- All horse/ponies must be over 4 years.
- No lunging in the warm up area.
- Only the person competing the horse may ride it on site and in the warm up arena.
- This competition will be run under BRC show jumping rules 2017. The judge's decision is final. Any competitor not adhering to the rules will be eliminated.
- The practice fence must not exceed the height of the class in progress – this will be checked.
- Teams will jump en-bloc, two rounds only. The second round will be timed to decide ALL team placings and individual placings.
- No rider may ride more than one horse/pony in any one team, and no horse/pony may compete twice in the same class with different riders.
- Declarations must be made at least half hour prior to commencement of the class by a team member to the steward. Competitors are advised to bring their horse passports but vaccination records will not be checked.
- It is the responsibility of the individual to familiarise themselves with the correct turnout requirements (particularly jewellery and hair) and permitted tack.
- BRC Rulebook 2017 can viewed on line – please ask if unsure well in advance of competing.
- Protective helmets must be worn to current safety standard as detailed in the BRC Rulebook 2017. Current hat standards can be viewed on [www.bkrc.co.uk](http://www.bkrc.co.uk).
- The wearing of body protectors is recommended.
- The organisers reserve the right to alter/ cancel classes at their discretion.
- Please leave the area around your horsebox/trailer/vehicle clean and tidy.
- Sweep up all hay and droppings – it is your responsibility to leave the site clean and tidy.
